## Results: Innovations & strategies were categorized into three themes

### 1. HOUSING



#### Innovations & strategies include:

- Housing First
- Permanent Supportive Housing
- Repurposed Hotels
- Shared Housing/Host Homes
- Tiny Homes, Trailers
- Landlord Engagement
- Progressive Engagement

### 2. ECONOMIC SECURITY



#### Innovations & strategies include:

- Direct Cash Transfers
- “Money Matching” or Match Savings Programs
- Education/training stipends
- Shallow (Rental) Subsidies
- Flexible “Flex” or Crisis Funds

### 3. WRAPAROUND SUPPORTS



#### Innovations & strategies include:

- Peer Support
- Mental Health Services & Outreach
- Case Management
- Harm Reduction
- Pet Accommodations
- Transportation

**Prioritize equity**

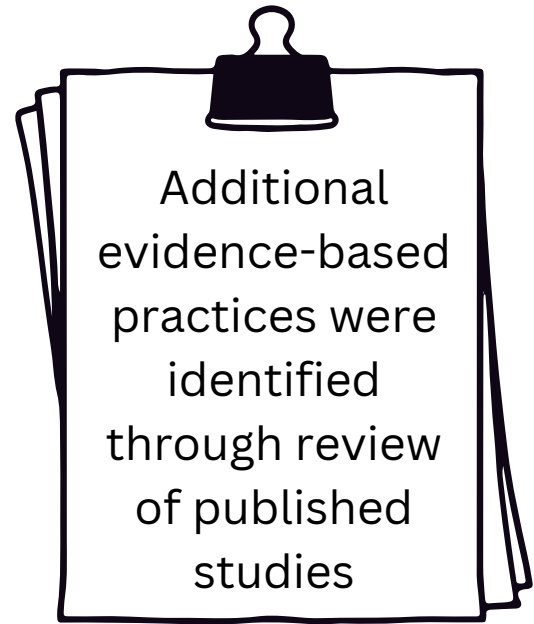
**Expand collaborations & coalitions**
